Considering that parental leave entitlements are an important part of a compensation package that helps organizations attract and retain the best talent, Mr. DJACTA does believe that it is crucial for the United Nations common system to lead by example and to formally establish a fair parental leave policies by adopting the best practices as an employer of choice and enhance its current parental leave provisions. Under his guidance, the ICSC has followed the recent global trends and particularly, the significant progress worldwide in expanding parental leave entitlements for all its staff.

Given his experience and expertise in the UN administrative, budgetary, and financial field, in particular his deep knowledge of the UN common system, if re-elected, Mr. Djacta for his second and last term as established by the 61/239 par 3 of GA resolution, would continue, to improve the Committee functioning, to provide effective support to the General Assembly in better leading the common system.
